Presenting the program will be Kathy Kahn along with two former company dancers, Merilee Magnuson Blaisdell, Mary Hanf Monzingo, and June Budd who was Lila's colleague in Laguna Beach Soroptimists and mother of company dancer Kathleen Budd.

The public is invited and there is no charge. The program will be videotaped and is to be televised on the local Cox Cable channel 30. The program will include a twenty minute documentary "A Loving Tribute" produced and directed by Jennifer and Steve Baker.

Kathy Kahn was formerly a soloist, ballet mistress, and resident choreographer for the Laguna Beach Civic Ballet which became Ballet Pacifica. For sixteen years, she directed the Laguna Beach Ballet Studio and has taught all ages and levels at numerous dance schools throughout Orange County. Kathy currently teaches at Coastline College, Orange Coast College and Southland Ballet Academy.

Lila Zali was born in 1918 and died in 2003. Lila Zali founded the Laguna Beach Civic Ballet in 1962 which became Ballet Pacifica. Before coming to Laguna Beach she danced professionally in the Mordkin Ballet, (forerunner to American Ballet Theatre), Col. de Basil's Ballet Russe and as the principal dancer on the CBS television show "Balleretta". Lila organized and choreographed a trio of dancers who toured the United States during World War II. The Three Debs included Barbara Stuart Rabinowitsh who also was a founder of the Laguna Greenbelt.

Lila Zali moved to Laguna Beach in 1959 with her husband Kolia Levienne. Lila served as director, choreographer, costume maker, fundraiser for the Laguna Beach Civic Ballet as well has teaching ballet to many Laguna Beach children and adults at her 1863 South Coast Highway studio. She continued to teach up until four days before her death at the age of 84.





Thanks to Jane Janz, we have this information "on Tuesday, January 11, 1949. According to Police Lt. Pletts, George Т. snowstorm began shortly after 3 AM and it lasted long enough to blanket the city with 'a mantle such as it had seen before.' never former police chief, Paul Johnson, recalled in 1949 that it had snowed briefly in Laguna in 1932, but most admitted it never lasted on the ground to the extent it did in 1949."
